<u>ORDER</u>

This Writ Petition has been filed for issuance of a Writ of Mandamus to forbear the respondents 3 to 5 from interfering petitioner right to practice electro Homeopathy in terms of the 1st respondent letter dated 05.05.2010 based on his representation dated 17.03.2020.



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2. It is the case of the petitioner is that the petitioner is a practitioner of alternative medicines like Allopathy, Yoga, Naturopathy, Ayurveda, Homepathy, Siddha or Unani. He has undergone Community Medical Service Certificate Course (CMS) and obtained B.E.M.S in CMS. However, the respondents are labeling the petitioner as unqualified and they are threatening legal action, thereby affecting the rights of the petitioner to do his profession in his fields. In the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition, the petitioner has stated that he will not go to the extent of causing harm to the life of his customers.

3. Heard, Mr.C.Prabakaran, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and Mr.V.J.Priyadarsana, learned Government Advocate (Criminal Side) appearing for the respondents 2, 4 & 5.

4. In the light of the said assurance given in the affidavit filed in support of the writ petition, the writ petition is disposed of, directing the respondents to permit the petitioner to practice in his field alone. So long as the petitioner is practicing in his mode of medicine, the





respondents and their police officials are restrained from initiating any action against them. However, it is open to the respondents or their officials to verify and find out whether, the petitioner is practicing in other fields viz. Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, Allopathy etc, and if the petitioner is practicing in such fields, it is open to the police officials to initiate action against the petitioner in accordance with law. Consequently, connected miscellaneous petition is closed. No costs.
